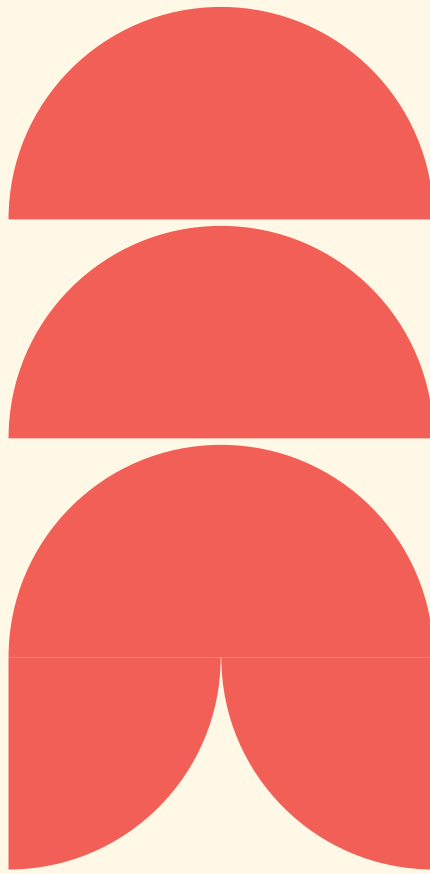

Supporting you all the way

From the moment you start with us, we'll have your back. The first few weeks will include a thorough induction and introduction – to our staff, workflow, and favourite coffee spots. During this period, you'll be eased in with a reduced patient load.

You'll be assigned a supervisor, and have fortnightly meetings with them throughout the entire programme. With several GPs on-site daily, access to on-the-spot advice is always available. For your more in-depth queries, an experienced Senior GP Consultant can help in the afternoons. There will also be regular in-house GPEP2/3 meetings with your fellow programme participants.

During your first year, we'll help you plan the clinical part of your fellowship programme. If you have a particular area of interest, this is the time to align the clinical component with your potential future GPSI specialisation. We'll also support you in completing the required clinical time through alternative options, including teaching, other primary care, or clinical work.

Life at Broadway

Every day starts with a morning hui at 8:50am. We chat about what the day holds, share feedback, reminders, celebrate special days, and share any important clinical information across the team.

Our GPs generally see patients from 9-12:30, and 2-5:30, but there is flexibility to tailor your schedule. You'll gradually build your own patient base, while also being rostered for acute patient sessions once or twice a week.

We believe in doing everything we can to let our GPs focus on what they do best – caring for patients. This includes:

- In-house supervision and peer support
- Regular Clinical Meetings to give the opportunity to share and address any particular subjects or questions
- Clinical admin support: inbox management, annotations, task prep, classifications
- Inbox coverage while you're on leave
- Healthcare assistants: chaperoning, appointment prep, and procedure support
- Nurse support for patient callbacks and follow-up
- On-site clinical pharmacist for medication queries and follow-up (titration)
- Admin support for invoicing, ACC, insurance, reception, and scanning
- Access to a senior GP consultant every afternoon
Opportunities to develop GPSI skills (such as MSK, Skin, Gynae, ADHD, GAHT, Lifestyle, Menopause, etc)
- Work with other pathways (Restrictive scope)

Employment

TERMS

We can offer you a financially attractive fixed term “Fast Track to Fellowship” employment agreement, giving you certainty over your earnings. Included in your contract are six weeks of leave, per year – four weeks annual leave, and two weeks of discretionary professional development leave to further your learning or attend conferences. After obtaining your fellowship, there is the opportunity to continue working at Broadway under a Fellowship contract.

Your work, growth and experience gained will be recognised in annual reviews.

EXPENSES

As part of the programme, we'll also refund your APC, MPS Indemnity Insurance, and College membership fees (if required). We're also able to offer you financial support for the academic component, as well as free ACLS training updates.

HEALTH INSURANCE

After six months of continuous employment, you may be eligible for free private health insurance – with no pre-existing conditions exclusions.

You'll also have the option of adding your spouse, and dependents, at competitive rates.

KIWISAVER

You'll be automatically enrolled, unless you choose to opt out.
